ACCORD publishes research on marriage and families

In February, Bishop Denis Nulty, President of ACCORD, published new research by ACCORD on marriage and families which was undertaken by consultants Amárach Research. It was published after the blessing of engaged couple Ms Leona Gallagher and Mr Paul McNulty at the Shrine of Saint Valentine in Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Whitefriar Street Church, in the Archdiocese of Dublin.



In his address Bishop Nulty said: "There is no doubt that in many parts of the world attitudes to marriage and the family have changed dramatically in recent years – including here in Ireland. So much so that many commentators, including Pope Francis, have spoken of marriage and the family as being *"in crisis"*. ACCORD speaks to this crisis through our work operating out of 55 centres with 936 committed professional volunteers being the face of ACCORD throughout the island of Ireland – North and South." A key finding of the research was that 65% of people agreed that a child is more likely to grow up happy if raised in a home with a loving mother and father.
