

Annual Knock Novena focuses on Faith and Family

The annual novena will take place from 14 to 22 August at Our Lady's Shrine, Knock, on the theme 'Faith and Family'. Daily ceremonies will be held in the Basilica at 3pm and 8.3opm and workshops will take place at 12noon and 6pm.

The 2015 novena will begin at the National Marian Shrine on Friday 14 August with His Eminence Cardinal Timothy Dolan of New York, who will preach on 'Faith and Family'. Primate of All Ireland Archbishop Eamon Martin of Armagh will celebrate Mass for the Feast of the Assumption on 15 August to mark the conclusion of the Rise of the Roses tour. The theme for this year's Croagh Patrick pilgrimage addressed how faith offers us real hope in our lives. At Mass in Lecanvey Church near the Reek, Archbishop Michael

Neary said: "Faith and religious values are central to the identity of many individuals and to the family as the crucible of personal relationships, enabling us to discover who we are. In our culture, these may have been eroded but they are not eclipsed. We may be tempted to consign faith and religion to private life and attempt to edit God out of the market place."
