INTRODUCTORY RITES: THE PENITENTIAL

ACT - This time in the Mass offers us an opportunity to prepare to receive Eucharist by reflecting on the things that we might have done during the past week for which we need forgiveness. We are reminded that God always loves us. One of the ways in which God shows this love is by always forgiving us for those times when we haven't been as good as we might have been. There are different kinds of prayers that the priest can use at this part of the Mass. These prayers do two things. They help us to remember the times when we haven't been as good as we might have been. More importantly they remind us of God's love for us. Sometimes the priest may replace the Penitential Act with the blessing and sprinkling of water as a reminder of our Baptism.

THE ADVENT WREATH – The wreath is made up of various evergreens, signifying continuous life. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolises the eternity of God. The four candles represent the four weeks of Advent. Three candles are purple and one is rose coloured. The purple candles symbolise prayer, penance and preparation. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday (Gaudete Sunday) and represents rejoicing. A white candles may be place in the middle of the wreath to represent Christ and is lit on Christmas Eve. BAMBINELLI SUNDAY - 17TH DECEMBER

For this past several decades, each year on Gaudete Sunday, the Third Sunday of Advent, children (and adults) bring their Baby Jesus figures from the crib at their homes to St. Peter's Square where the Pope will bless both the people and the figurines during the Angelus.

This year we will celebrate "Bambinelli Sunday" at all our Masses on Sat./Sun. $16^{th} / 17^{th}$ Dec. All are invited to bring the Baby Jesus figure from their homes to any of the Masses to be blessed. Families can even make their own "Bambinelli" if they want. We would love, not just families with children, but all families to have a crib in their home this year.

Following the blessing, take your "Bambinelli" home and place it in a gift box, wrap it, and save it for Christmas. Let this be the first gift your family opens on Christmas, when together you place your Baby Jesus figure in the crib, and have a home blessing of the Nativity for your whole family.

"LETS CHANGE TOMORROW" - The group "Lets change Tomorrow" would like to thank all those who very kindly donated to our refugee appeal during the week $19^{th} - 26^{th}$ Nov. We have passed the aid on and it is leaving Ireland on Thurs. 30th Nov. It will be shipped to Ostend in Holland, then travel overland through Europe to Greece.
