LEARNING ABOUT THE MASS WITH KATH AND QUMEN - WHAT THE PRIEST WEARS - The special clothes that the priest wears for Mass are called vestments. There are three different pieces, which he needs to put on. Over his ordinary clothes the priest puts on a white or cream coloured tunic called an alb. Then he puts on a long piece of coloured cloth, which looks like a scarf and is called a stole. Over the alb and the stole he puts on his chasuble. The colour of the stole and the chasuble is very important. It tells us what season we are in or what special occasion we are celebrating in the Church year. There are four main colours worn during the year: green, purple, red and white.

THE ADVENT WREATH – The wreath is made up of various evergreens, signifying continuous life. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolises the eternity of God. The four candles represent the four weeks of Advent. Three candles are purple and one is rose coloured. The purple candles symbolise prayer, penance and preparation. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday (Gaudete Sunday) and represents rejoicing. A white candles may be place in the middle of the wreath to represent Christ and is lit on Christmas Eve.
