## CENTENARY OF THE DEATH OF **COLUMBAN MISSIONARY IN CHINA**

A commemorative Mass and dedication of a plaque commissioned by the Cullen Family to mark the death of Fr. Charles Cullen, a Columban Missionary, will be celebrated at 2.00 pm. on 13th July 2023 by Columban Fathers Neil Collins and Dan Troy in St. Patrick's Church. Fr Charles was born in Dungiven on 18th April 1896 to Charles Cullen (Snr) a former Principal Teacher in St. Patrick's Primary School and local girl Mary Teresa O'Neill. The family later moved to Co. Down. However Fr. Charles's education at St. Columb's continued to maintain a close bond with Dungiven particularly with his cousin Frances Boyle née McReynolds and her husband James "Yankee" Boyle. Charles was ordained on 9th June 1921 and sailed for China in September of that year as part of the "Maynooth Mission". Fr. Charles died 2 years later on 13th July 1923 aged 27, not merely the first Columban Missionary to die there but possibly the first Irishman of any order to die in that country. He had written a testimony before his departure in which he said "It is my dearest wish that I should be buried in Dungiven under the monument of Mr Boyle. This may seem peculiar but I must say that from the priests and people of that parish (which I look upon as that of my birth and which I consider my parish) I in life never received anything but kindness such as I never deserved or never could deserve. Besides I should like to rest near the mortal remains of Mr & Mrs Boyle who in life showed themselves more than friends to me". Sadly his aspiration could not be realised and Charles was buried in his parish of Ko-Cha-Dzae (now Bai-Guo-Shu or White Fruit Tree). All parishioners are welcome to attend the Mass, which will be followed by a short account of the family connection to Dungiven and Charles's life and work as a Columban Missionary and dedication of the plaque to mark the centenary of his passing.
